Alcotest Instrument for Standard Time Period October 28 - November 4, 2012

In 2005, President Bush signed the Energy Policy Act of 2005, 42 <u>U.S.C.</u> sec. 15801. This Act, the relevant portion of which is attached, changes the dates of Daylight Savings Time effective 2007. As a result, Daylight Savings Time will end on the first Sunday in November instead of the last Sunday in October. Therefore, we will revert to Eastern Standard Time on Sunday, November 4, 2012, instead of Sunday, October 28, 2012.

The Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C New Jersey firmware version 3.11 is configured to automatically revert to Eastern Standard Time based on the pre-2007 timetable. Therefore, instead of changing to Eastern Standard Time on November 4, 2012, the Alcotest 7110 MK III-C will change on October 28, 2012. Commencing at 02:00 on October 28, 2012, the instrument will record all times, both printed and electronic, with an "S" suffix, indicating Standard Time.

The instrument's recordation of Standard Time rather than Daylight Savings Time does not affect the method of analysis or the accuracy of the readings. All current procedures for the processing of arrested intoxicated drivers are to continue, including the 20 minute observation period currently part of the regular protocol. However, because the Alcotest is set to read in Standard Time for the week between October 28 and November 4, Breath Test Operators should enter the time of arrest in the Alcotest instrument in Standard Time (one hour earlier than Daylight Savings Time). Entries on all other documents related to the arrest (e.g., police reports) should reflect Daylight Savings Time which will remain in effect until November 4, 2012.





Please inform all local law enforcement personnel to direct any questions regarding the implementation of this interim procedure to their respective New Jersey State Police Breath Test Coordinator or the Municipal Prosecutor Supervisor within the respective County Prosecutor's Office.

In 2005, President Bush signed the Energy Policy Act of 2005, 42 <u>U.S.C.</u> sec. 15801. This Act, the relevant portion of which is attached, changes the dates of Daylight Savings Time effective 2007. As a result, Daylight Savings Time will begin on the second Sunday in March (March 11, 2012) instead of the first Sunday in April (April 1, 2012).

The Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C New Jersey firmware version 3.11 is configured to automatically convert to Daylight Savings Time based on the pre-2007 timetable. Therefore, instead of changing to Daylight Savings Time on March 11, 2012, the Alcotest 7110 MK III-C will change on April 1, 2012. Prior to April 1, 2012, the instrument will continue to record all times, both printed and electronic, with an "S" suffix, indicating Standard Time. At 02:00 on April 1, 2012, the instrument's time recording will automatically change to a "D" suffix, indicating Daylight Savings Time.

The instrument's recordation of Standard Time rather than Daylight Savings Time does not affect the method of analysis or the accuracy of the readings. All current procedures for the processing of arrested intoxicated drivers are to continue, including the 20 minute observation period currently part of the regular protocol. However, because the Alcotest is set to read in Standard Time during that period of time, Breath Test Operators should enter the time of arrest in the Alcotest instrument in Standard Time (one hour earlier than Daylight Savings Time). Entries on all other documents related to the arrest (e.g., police reports) should reflect Daylight Savings Time effective March 11, 2012.
